# SB 667 - 84(R) by Eltife (Smithee)

#### 2015 Amendments Passed

- 1. Provided ability to Pool Risk with Other Captives
- 2. Permitted Captives to Take Credit for Reinsurance for:
  - Risk reinsured to a pool
  - Risk reinsured to an affiliated captive
- Confirmed that shareholder dividends are permitted subject to prior approval by the Commissioner.



# HB 1944 – 85(R) by Murphy (Hughes)

#### 2017 Amendments Passed

- 1. Authorizes a Texas captive insurance company to take credit for reinsurance ceded to a non-affiliated reinsurer when specific requirements are met.
- Authorizes a Texas captive insurance company to be formed as a reciprocal insurance exchange.
- 3. Simplifies the corporate formation processes between the Secretary of State and the Department of Insurance.
- Allows capital and surplus to be held in the form of Texas county or municipal bonds.



## HB 1944 - 85(R)

#### 2017 Amendments Passed (continued)

- 5. Waives the requirement to provide an actuarial report with the captive's annual filing under certain circumstances.
- 6. Eliminates the requirement that the captive must have a licensed claims adjuster if the claims are limited to first party claims of the parent and/or affiliates of the captive.
- 7. Allows a captive insurance company to insure life insurance benefits for employee benefits subject to ERISA (Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974).



### Texas Legislature Appropriations Process

- Begins in the even numbered years between sessions
- State Agencies prepare Legislative Appropriation Requests (LARs)
- LARs submitted by late summer/early fall
- Legislative Budget Board (LBB) and Governor's Office meet with agency staff to review LAR
- LBB works with leadership to develop general appropriations bill
- Session begins in January



### Texas Legislature Appropriations Process

- Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committee begin hearings on appropriations bill
- Changes are made to reflect funding priorities and spending limits
- House and Senate share their versions of the bill
- Conference committee is appointed to iron out differences
- House and Senate pass budget
- Governor has line item veto
