Horace Hobbs joined Phillips 66 as the Chief Economist in October of 2013. He is primarily focused on long range planning and capital allocation for the global portfolio of Phillips 66 businesses. He has spent his entire thirty year career in the energy industry, primarily as a management consultant, and also as an operating executive.

Prior to joining Phillips 66, Horace was Managing Director of Muse Stancil & Co, a boutique, global consulting firm, where he was focused on downstream strategy and provided a broad array of merger, acquisition, and divestiture advisory services. He provided industry analysis and business planning support for operating companies, project and technology developers, equity investors, and financial institutions.

Horace spent five years as part of the start up executive team for Longhorn Pipeline and was previously employed as a downstream industry consultant at Wright Killen & Co. and The Pace Consultants (Now Jacobs Consultancy). He spent the early years of his career as a chemical engineer involved in process design and advanced process control applications.
